1. **HOOR** (plural = HOURS);
2. **MINUTE** (plural = MINUTES);
3. **SECOND** (plural = SECONDS);
4. **ONE O'CLOCK** = 01:00 A.M. or P.M.;
5. FIVE AFTER ONE or ONE-OH-FIVE = 01:05 a.m. OR p.m.;
6. TEN AFTER ONE or ONE-TEN = 01:10;
7. A QUARTER AFTER ONE or ONE-FIFTEEN = 01:15 O'CLOCK;
8. TWENTY AFTER ONE or ONE-TWENTY = 01:20 O'CLOCK;
9. HALF PAST ONE or ONE-THIRTY = 01:30 O'CLOCK;
10. TWENTY TO TWO or ONE-FORTY = 01:40;
11. A QUARTER TO TWO or ONE-FORTY-FIVE = 01:45 O'CLOCK;
12. **DAWN** = BEFORE THE SUN RISES, FIRST LIGHT OF THE DAY;
13. **SUNRISE** = THE TIME WHEN THE SUN APPEARS IN THE SKY;
14. **MORNING** = FOR EXAMPLE, 07:00 a.m.;
15. **NOON** = 12:00 p.m.;
16. **AFTERNOON** = FOR EXAMPLE, 03:00 p.m.;
17. **SUNSET** = TIME WHEN THE SUN DISAPPEARS IN THE SKY;
18. **EVENING** = E.G., 08:30 p.m., UNTIL YOU GO TO BED;
19. **NIGHT** = SUN HAS SET AND IT IS DARK OUTSIDE;
20. **MIDNIGHT** = 12:00 a.m., THE MIDDLE OF THE NIGHT;

21. **EARLY** = E.G., 08:40 a.m.;
22. **ON TIME** = 09:00 a.m.;
23. **LATE** = E.G., 09:25 a.m.;
24. **DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME** = MARCH TO NOVEMBER,
THE CLOCKS ARE SET ONE HOUR FORWARD
SO THAT PEOPLE CAN HAVE LONGER LIGHT
IN THE EVENING, e.g. EUROPEAN DST;
25. **STANDARD TIME** = NOVEMBER TO MARCH,
THE CLOCKS ARE SET ONE HOUR BACKWARD
WHICH IS THE OFFICIAL LOCAL TIME OF A
REGION OR COUNTRY, e.g. EUROPEAN ST;
26. **WAYS TO TALK ABOUT TIME:**
I wake up at 07:00 a.m.
I wake up at 07:00 in the morning.
I wake up at 07:00.
What time do you wake up on weekdays?
At 07:00 a.m. How about you?
I wake up at 06:00 a.m.
When do you study?

27. A **CALENDAR** is a particular system for dividing TIME into
periods such as **YEARS, MONTHS, WEEKS** and **DAYS**,
often starting from a particular point in history.
The Christian calendar has **52 WEEKS**, or **12 MONTHS**,
or **365 Days** in one year.
*The Christian calendar was originally based on
the Julian calendar of the Romans.*
28. **DAYS OF THE WEEK:**
Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday,
Saturday, Sunday;

29. **MONTHS OF THE YEAR:**

January (1st month, 31 days), February (29 days),
March (31 days), April (30 days), May (31 days),
June (30 days), July (31 days), August (31 days),
September (30 days), October (31 days), November
(30 days), December (12th month, has 31 days);

30. **LEAP YEAR:**

In a leap year the February has 29 days, usually every
four (4) years for the time being. In a standard year
the month of February has 28 days.

31. **SEASONS OF THE YEAR:**

SPRING, SUMMER, AUTUMN (or FALL in the USA),
WINTER;
