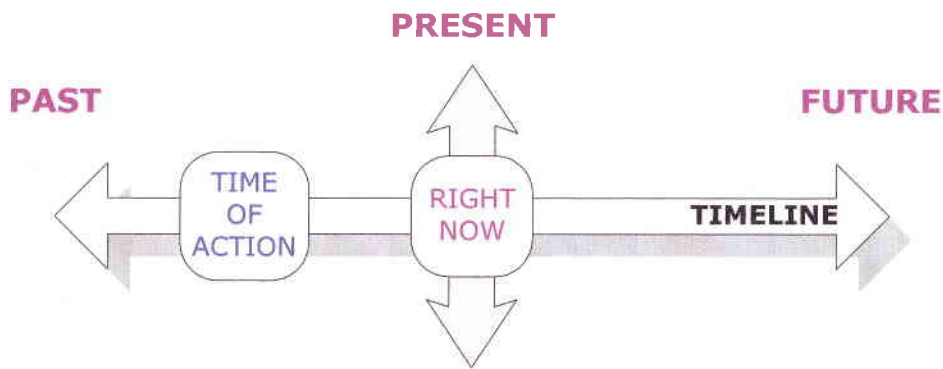


(SIMPLE) PRESENT TENSE

ACTIONS, EVENTS, or SITUATIONS that ALWAYS, HABITUALLY, or USUALLY EXIST. They have existed in the PAST, exist NOW, and will PROBABLY exist in the FUTURE.

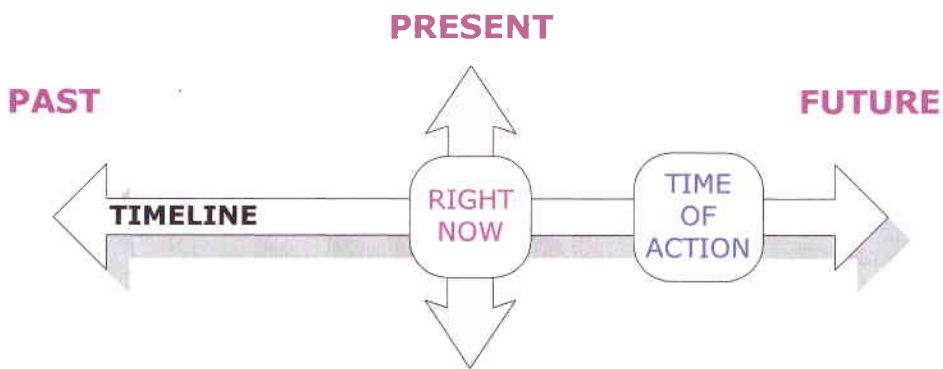
Planet Earth **IS** roughly round. It **SNOWS** in Australia, Austria, China and other locations on Earth.



(SIMPLE) PAST TENSE

At ONE PARTICULAR TIME in the PAST an ACTION happened. It began and ended in the PAST.

Planet Earth **WAS** hotter when the Dinosaurs lived. Earthonaut Franz **VISITED** the local library yesterday.



(SIMPLE) FUTURE TENSE

At ONE PARTICULAR TIME in the FUTURE an ACTION will happen.

It **WILL BE** hot on New Year's Day. Earthonaut Franz **WILL DIE** one day. Planet Earth **WILL LOSE** its water.
